Dear Members,

2020 has been very eventful so far, to say the least. For our Local, it began with the transition to our new facility at 635 Wilton Grove Road. We officially moved in on January 13th, and construction will be ongoing throughout the year. Upon completion, there will be a grand opening (once social distancing measures allow for it), as well as a member open house to celebrate this exciting new development in our Local's history.

We have also been busy enhancing member benefits with the addition of coverage for medical cannabis, the adoption of the MembersHealth telemedicine program, and the establishment of the LiUNA Wellness Centre, which will re-open as soon as it is safe to do so. The Optical Centre has expanded, and we are also very excited to announce that we have added a chiropractic, physiotherapy, and massage studio, with plans for a dental office in the near future. Keep an eye on your inbox and our social media channels for further updates and details.

There has also been a concerted effort to increase member engagement with family events such as the Storybook Gardens family skate night, our spectacularly well-attended LiUNA Day at The Factory and, although it ended up being cancelled due to the public health situation, our planned sponsorship day with London Lightning Basketball. We have also continued to leverage the strength and numbers of our union to secure discounts for you at various businesses in the London and Grey-Bruce regions.

We have continued to foster our relationships with all three levels of government, which has resulted in significant funding opportunities for our Training Centre. This dialogue ensures that government officials recognize

the important role Local 1059 serves in our community and local economy, and the powerful voice LiUNA members collectively have in supporting legislation that is favourable to our membership and the goals of our union.

2020 will feature a number of firsts, including distribution of the inaugural James MacKinnon Local 1059 Scholarship Fund scholarships to worthy recipients. On the topic of our website, we are also excited to announce that we will very shortly be launching a brand new and improved Local 1059 site. ### The Kingsmen Group Inc.

Through negotiations, Local 1059 reached a deal with The Kingsmen Group Inc. (formerly Senator Homes) for a \$4 increase over the next 3 years for our members. This is the biggest increase we have ever had within the home building sector. The Kingsmen Group is the largest volume home builder in Woodstock, building approximately 200 homes per year. There are currently six members in the bargaining unit, but this will increase at pace with production over the coming years.

I'm pleased to report that Jameson Landscaping – operating out of the Grey-Bruce area – has entered into a voluntary agreement with Local 1059. They are looking to expand their business, and this is a great opportunity for both parties.

### Ramkey Communications, Inc.


After years spent arguing its case at the Ontario Labour Relations Board (OLRB), the Divisional Court and the Ontario Court of Appeal, Ramkey Communications Inc. appealed to the Supreme Court of Canada (our country's top court). On May 7, 2020, the Court dismissed Ramkey's appeal, which means that Ramkey is subject to provincial regulation. Local 1059 holds the bargaining rights for all construction labourers employed by Ramkey as originally certified by the OLRB. This was a hard fought win for Local 1059 and LIUNA, and will influence all future certifications in the Utility Sector. As always, we are thrilled when a decision can impact our membership in such a positive way, and this sets an important precedent that will help protect Local 1059 members in future.

### Van Horne Construction Ltd.

Van Horne Construction Ltd. was caught utilizing a non-union company to perform our jurisdictional work, and was not recognizing Local 1059's bargaining rights. We grieved the company for this violation of our agreement and received damages in the amount of \$11,000. This helps ensure that our bargaining rights are recognized in the future, and that any labourers' work performed by Van Horne Construction Ltd. – including any sub-contracted work – is carried out by Local 1059 members.

This 12-week, tuition-free program gives you a crash course in all the entry level skills and experience you'll need to be successful and stay safe during your apprenticeship, setting you on the path to a satisfying, stable, and well-paid career. ## Medical Cannabis Coverage

We would like to remind our members that as of January 1, 2020, medical cannabis became a reimbursable expense through the Benefit Trust Fund for certain pre-determined conditions. This applies to all members and their eligible dependants (subject to the eligibility provisions).

The conditions eligible for medical cannabis coverage are:

- Neuropathic/Chronic pain
- Palliative care
- Nausea/vomiting from chemotherapy treatments
- Spasticity (Multiple Sclerosis)
- Spinal cord injury
- Anorexia

The plan will provide coverage for a maximum of \$2000 per member and per each eligible dependant per calendar year.

We have partnered with Starseed Medicinal Inc. (a Health Canada licensed medical cannabis company) to provide you and your eligible dependants with

preferred pricing and electronic claim reimbursement for medical cannabis products, which means no out-of-pocket transactions are necessary. For information on how to register with Starseed, contact their Client Care Team at 1-844-756-7333. While Starseed is our preferred supplier, there is no obligation to use this company in order to receive medical cannabis coverage. However, if you use a different supplier, pre-authorization by a medical professional will still be required, and you will need to submit your claim manually for reimbursement. ■



## MembersHealth

For the past few months, we have been involved in a pilot program offering a new healthcare service called MembersHealth. Many of you registered for the service and took advantage of all it has to offer. As such, we are pleased to inform our members that we will be adding MembersHealth as a permanent service included in your comprehensive benefits plan through the Local 1059 Benefit Trust!

In late fall 2019, you received a package via email or regular mail outlining the registration process and benefits of MembersHealth. The service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Once you register, you can connect with a doctor via a video call in minutes using your phone, tablet, or PC. The doctor can provide various medical services including diagnosis of ailments, writing and renewing prescriptions, referrals to specialists, and ordering lab tests like urinalysis and bloodwork. This service is particularly helpful if you don't have a family doctor, but even if you do, it can still help you avoid the wasted time and frustration of walk-in clinics to receive care when your doctor's office is closed.

Some examples of common ailments a MembersHealth doctor can help you with include:

- Infections
- Sprains
- Skin irritations/allergic reactions
- Birth control, STIs and UTIs
- Anxiety/depression
- Coughs/colds/flu/fevers
- Lots more! ■

## Ontario Minister of Labour, Training and Skills Development Announces nearly \$1M in Funding for Pre-Apprenticeships

In late January, we were pleased to host the Hon. Monte McNaughton (Ontario Minister of Labour, Training and Skills Development) at our Training Centre. The Minister was joined by his colleague the Hon. Jill Dunlop (Associate Minister of Children and Women's Issues) to announce over \$900,000 in pre-apprenticeship funding to help address the skilled trades shortage in our region. They also tried their hand at some cement finishing and tapping a water main. We extend a big thank you to both Ministers for taking the time to check out our state-of-the-art training centre, and for your continued support of the skilled trades in Ontario! ■



## UPDATE: Your Record of Training (ROT) Card

All construction sector members now have both a QR code and a new Access Code. When you/your employers visit our main website ([www.liunatocal1059.com](http://www.liunatocal1059.com)), you will find a tab along the top that says 'ROT Card'. From there, you can enter the code shown on the card or scan it using your smartphone to see your credentials. The short URL code on the card is being replaced by this new Access Code. However, the short URL will still work for those who have the older card. **No change or action is required by members.**

The online ROT access shows you which certificates are coming due. If the card is highlighted yellow, you need to call the Training Centre (519-455-5299) as soon as possible to sign up for that course. A red highlight indicates that your ticket is no longer valid. Be sure to stay on top of your training requirements; it helps you stay employable and ready for work in a variety of sectors. ■



- Must be planning to attend a recognized Canadian post-secondary institution or an equivalent in the same calendar year in which you apply. This includes candidates graduating from an Ontario high school this year as well as those already attending a post-secondary institution
- Must be registered as a full-time attendee in their program
- Must submit a completed application package by 11:59PM on June 26, 2020


## Local 1059 at the London Home Builders' Lifestyle Home Show

## SON Votes No on DGR Facility in Bruce County

We are disappointed to relay the news that members of the Saugeen Ojibway Nation (SON) have voted down the proposed plan for a permanent nuclear waste DGR (Deep Geological Repository). While we respect this decision, it is unfortunate news for our Local, since the facility would have provided years of employment for a significant

number of our members. With regard to a high level waste repository, the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) has narrowed their search to two host communities, including South Bruce. Site selection will be determined by 2023, with selection of South Bruce resulting in job opportunities for members of Local 1059. ■
