It was an incredibly busy year for the Local in 2022. In fact, our members in construction contributed nearly 6 million hours worked last year, a record for the Local. At the same time, we bargained a significant number of collective agreements addressing one of the issues currently impacting members the most: inflation. With the increased cost of living, fuel, and groceries, we wanted to ensure you and your family feel secure during these challenging times. The collective agreement settlements reflect this.

We have also focused a great deal on growing our membership. We recently added 22 new employers to our ranks from a variety of sectors including landscaping, fencing, utilities, and locates – areas in which we have been working to make new and improved inroads. We also continue to direct our energies toward connecting with and recruiting from historically under-represented groups such as women, Indigenous communities, and new Canadians.

Right now, Local 1059 is laying the groundwork for recruiting youth and new high school/college graduates into a career in the skilled trades. We've started this year's recruitment push through career fairs and building relationships with local school boards and other organizations. If you know a young person who is (or might be) interested in a lucrative career in construction, please be sure to send them our way.

The first quarter of 2023 has been busy too. Not only have we continued to negotiate improvements to collective agreements, we've expanded our Wellness Centre and Training Centre to accommodate growing numbers of members and apprentices. Those additions were finished at an important time. New classrooms in the Training Centre are welcoming this spring what we believe will be our largest apprenticeship group ever.

We've also hosted a slate of member-focused events including our Family Skate Night at Storybook Gardens, our annual London Lightning Basketball game, and the massively popular Local 1059 Day at The Factory. Be sure to save the dates for upcoming events including our charity golf tournaments in London and Port Elgin, as well as events at Delaware and Sauble speedways, just to name a few. Keep an eye on your inbox and social media channels for registration and ticket details. These events always sell out, so please act early to avoid disappointment.




TOOLS in the Trades

Government Relations

In November, we were pleased to host the Honourable Filomena Tassi, Minister responsible for the Federal Economic Development Agency (Fed-Dev) for Southern Ontario at the Local 1059 Training Centre, along with MP Arielle Kayabaga (London West) and MP Peter Fragiskatos (London North Centre). Alongside a detailed tour of the Training Centre, we had a chance to speak with the Minister about a number of issues of concern to Local 1059, its employers, and membership, including government funding for construction projects, Employment Insurance barriers, and immigration reform. We thank the Minister for her ongoing interest in hearing our on-the-ground feedback about how the Government of Canada can help bolster and streamline processes and policies impacting the construction industry.

In early January, Business Manager Brandon MacKinnon and several Local 1059 staff and Business Representatives attended the Mayor's annual State of the City Address hosted by the London Chamber of Commerce. Mayor Morgan spoke about the key issues and challenges affecting Londoners and the value of coming together as a community to solve these issues. He noted that London is the fastest-growing city in Ontario. This comes as no surprise. The need for increased housing and infrastructure to support our growing community is urgent and vital.

On March 15 we were pleased to host the Hon. Monte McNaughton, Minister of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development. He announced important proposed amendments to the Construction Projects Regulation including the need for PPE to be properly fitted to women and diverse body types and ensure access to clean women's-only washrooms on the job site. Minister McNaughton was joined by the Hon. Charmaine Williams, Associate Minister of Women's Social and Economic Opportunity, Deepak Anand, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development, MPPs Rob Flack and Bob Bailey, London Mayor Josh Morgan, and Lucan-Biddulph Mayor Cathy Burghardt-Jesson 📕













LEGAL AND LEGISLATIVE

Advertising

We continue to push advertising for Local 1059 in multiple channels. These include our tried-and-true go-to places like hockey arena rink boards and changing room doors, as well as our ongoing roadside billboard campaign and social media/online advertising. Heading into the new year we are also looking at opportunities for exposure in TV, online, and mobile advertising, with an emphasis on video ads and showcasing the diversity of our membership





Working for Workers Act

In March, Ontario Premier Doug Ford's government unveiled proposed changes to the Working For Workers Act, building on labour-related improvements included in similar bills over the past couple of years.

If adopted, the new legislation will:

- Increase maximum fines that may be imposed on employers under the Occupational Health and Safety Act.
- Increase protections for workers that take time away from their jobs on reservist leave
- Provide mass termination notice and pay provision to employees who work from home.
- Strengthen rules and standards protecting immigrant workers.
- Allow students in Grade 11 to transition to full-time skilled trades apprenticeship programs.

Increase to Provincial Minimum Wage

Ontario announced at the end of March that it will raise the province's minimum wage later this year to \$16.55 per hour. The new minimum wage will help workers meet the rising costs of living when it takes effect this October. The bump will make Ontario's minimum wage the third highest in the country. The Yukon's minimum wage is \$16.77 per hour and the federal minimum wage in Canada is \$16.65

Introduction of the Skills Development Fund

As part of its 2023 budget, the province announced a \$224-million dollar investment into the Skills Development Fund with \$75 million more to be invested over the next three years. The additional funds will provide eligible applicants – including unions – with money to build new training centres or upgrade existing facilities with state-ofthe-art technology

Union Updates

A new collective agreement for over 100 members in fencing includes a 19 per cent wage increase (an additional \$7.55 per hour) scheduled in increments over the next three years, heavily front-loaded to offset recent cost of living increases due to inflation. Also included in the agreement is better coverage of lodging expenses, increased premiums for vacuum truck drivers and CWB welders, and a boot and clothing credit increase.

New collective agreements for around 1,000 members in sewer and watermain, curb, gutter, sidewalk, asphalt, and bridges include wage increases of \$7.50 per hour scheduled in increments over the next three years. The new agreements for these sectors also include substantially increased coverage for expenses such as travel time, lodging, food, and work wear, and represent some of the largest settlements in Local 1059 history.

A grievance with Titan Contracting Group, a Windsor-based company building a retail store in Stratford, was settled in April. Since the beginning of the project, Titan had been violating a collective agreement by assigning to nonunion workers jobs that fell under Local 1059's jurisdiction, including tending of masons and carpenters, pouring placing and finishing of concrete, and fencing work. As settlement. Local 1059 received \$10,000 in damages and immediately placed workers with the company.

New Era Concrete, one of our newest signatory employers, has signed a Voluntary Recognition Agreement to ensure their required labour force specializing in concrete and epoxy flooring is supplied by Local 1059 members. The agreement represents New Era's acknowledgement that our members are essential to the growth of the company.

After months of negotiating and several demonstrations from Local 1059 and its supporters, the lockout of two service-sector members in St. Thomas is officially over. Locked out of their jobs in February, the pair of cleaners with Serv-U-Clean Inc. returned to work in May with several improvements to their working conditions.

We'd like to thank everyone who showed their support throughout this process and Serv-U-Clean Inc.'s management for their work resolving this issue.

Local 1059 has hired a new business representative to help address the needs of members in four growing sectors.

Joseph Calvo, a Londoner with 10 years of construction experience – including eight as a Local 1059 member – became the union's newest business representative in March. He'll be covering the utilities, gas distribution, locates, and railway sectors with Business Representative Josh Stewart, a sector co-ordinator whose portfolio also includes fencing, line painting, restoration, and residential driveways.

Liuna Local 1059 Welcoming Ukrainian Refugees as Russian Invasion Continues

February marked the first anniversary of Russia's full-scale

invasion of Ukraine. The ongoing war has since forced more than 8 million Ukrainians in Europe to register as refugees while another 5.3 million continue to be displaced inside their own country, according to estimates from the U.N. refugee centre recently published by NPR.

So far, about 170,000 Ukrainian refugees have come to Canada. One of them is Anton Ivaschenko, now a Local 1059 member who will soon be returning to Pickard Construction in Owen Sound.

Ivaschenko comes from a family of labourers. His two older brothers are construction workers in Poland and Czechia. Poland, which shares a border with Ukraine, is where Ivaschenko got his start in construction as a student installing bumpers onto roadways.

"The people are very friendly, and there are very good laws in Canada which are enforced," Ivaschenko told Local 1059 when we asked about his new home. "The nature is very beautiful and it is very peaceful here."

Local 1059 member Abram Mackay and his son Julian helped Ivaschenko land on his feet when he got to Canada, offering him a place to stay until he could get settled. They've been volunteering with an organization in Toronto assisting refugees arriving in Ontario.

"Refugees come here because of necessity," Mackay said. "They have lost family, friends, and basically their entire lives. Giving a refugee an opportunity is giving a second chance at life. I'm sure most would be extremely grateful and work hard to prove they are deserving."

Local 1059 is honoured to represent Ivaschenko during this challenging transition and would like to thank both the Mackays and Pickard Construction for their efforts to help settle one of the newest members of our community.

Inside the Local 1059 training centre, our instructors are also doing their part to help refugees who have come to Canada searching for stability.

Training Co-ordinator Andrew Duarte recently helped two Ukrainian refugees receive working at heights certification by using technology to translate the day-long course into their language in real time. A pair of tablets cleverly set up by Duarte captured both his voice and the written material the Ukrainianspeaking workers needed to understand.

The workers ended up achieving perfect final exam scores and are now members of LiUNA Local 183 in Toronto.

Filling the skilled trades gap in Ontario will require all hands on deck and Local 1059 is proud of our members and instructors going the extra mile to provide people a rewarding career, regardless of their first language


