\$830k Grant Helps Launch Training Centre Renovations Local 1059 Hosts First Ever Trades Awareness Day James Mackinnon Scholarship Fund Supports 27 Students

Dear Members,

As we head from summer into fall, contributed construction hours continue to hold steady despite work recently slowing down in a number of sectors. Due to high interest rates, residential construction — specifically single-family homes — has slowed as developers, home builders, and home buyers wait for a sign that rates will stabilize. Fortunately, because our organization and the work we perform is so diverse, members have been able to find jobs in busier sectors.

The Local continues to grow and expand. To make room for this growth, we've successfully obtained an Apprentice Capital Grant from the provincial government worth \$830,000. The funds will be used to cover a significant renovation in our Training Centre that will unlock extra classrooms and training space.

The Local has also applied to the province's Skills Development Fund for potential funding that would allow us to build a northern satellite office and Training Centre to serve members and signatory contractors in Huron, Perth, Grey, and Bruce counties. We are hoping to receive positive news about our application in the coming months.

The Local is constantly trying to bring awareness to the skilled trades and the great career opportunities they provide. We hosted our first annual LiUNA Local 1059 Trades Awareness Day in May. Community members from London and the surrounding area attended the event to learn more about the education and experiences our Local has to offer. The event was successful, directly resulting in the recruitment of new apprentices and new skilled members.

The Local's three charity golf tournaments were also very successful this summer, raising a total of \$212,000 for United Way branches in Southwestern Ontario. To accommodate high demand, next year's employer/industry tournament in London will grow to include two simultaneous events. Local 1059 has now donated nearly \$2 million to the United Way over the past 23 years. We should be proud of the significant impact this money will have in the communities we work and live in.

Finally, on behalf of the Local's staff and its entire Executive Board, I want to reiterate how grateful we are to represent your interests day in and day out. We have the best, most skilled workforce in the region, hands down. We are proud to work on your behalf to continue to grow and strengthen this great Local.

#### **BUSINESS REP RE-CAP**

A significant grievance filed against EAN Construction **Group Limited was** successfully settled in August. The company had failed to pay members for their pension, benefits, and training remittances, among other obligations. As part of the settlement, all affected members will be made whole. In total, Local 1059 will recover more than \$180,000.

Hernandez Construction, one of our newest signatory employers, has signed a Voluntary Recognition Agreement that will ensure their required labour force specializing in demolition and asbestos abatement is supplied by Local 1059. This agreement represents an acknowledgement from Hernandez Construction that our members are essential to the growth of the company.

Local 1059 has recently certified The Restorers Group Inc. and negotiations are ongoing to finalize a collective agreement allowing our members to perform more work in the restoration sector.

We have also ratified a historic collective agreement with Foundation **Building Materials** that includes a 12.4 per cent wage increase over the next three years, as well as other language that will benefit the overall health and wellbeing of the bargaining unit.

Our industrial sector has been busy bargaining with employers this summer. Thanks to many hard-working teams, we have ratified deals for workers with the following companies:

- Metropolitan Maintenance (Cleaners at Pall Mall in London)
- GDI (Cleaners at White Oaks Mall in London)

We will continue working hard to get fair deals at the following locations. Please support these members as we bargain:

- Commercial Cleaning Services (Custodians at Kettle Creek, Springfield, West Lorne, Monsignor Morrison, and South Dorchester public schools)
- GDI (Cleaners at City Centre in London)
- Commercial Cleaning Services (Cleaners at provincial government buildings in London)
- Toure (Custodians at Robarts School for the Deaf in London)

We are extremely concerned about the loss of work at The Table and Chair Company, a long-standing London furniture store now going out of business as its owner retires. We're fighting on behalf of 18 employees for a fair closure agreement that honours over 169 years of collective labour. Local 1059 will support these workers with whatever comes next.

In the fall, we're going back to the table to bargain deals for the following locations:

- Precise Janitorial (Arva)
- Metropolitan Maintenance (City Wide and Bell buildings in London)
- A-plus (Cleaners for London social housing units)

- ServiceMaster (Cleaners at various City of London sites)
- GDI (Cleaners at One London Place)

Two grievances with L-82 Construction related to subcontracting violations have been successfully settled this summer.

L-82 violated its collective agreement with Local 1059 in June when the company hired a non-unionized contractor for a job in northwest London without providing any supporting evidence that it was unable to secure a union contractor for the work.

A second grievance was filed a month later after L-82 again subcontracted utility work to a non-unionized company, this time for work on a project in south London, without providing proper justification.

L-82 has agreed it violated the collective agreement in both cases and has paid \$10,000 in total damages. L-82 has also agreed to notify a minimum of four Local 1059 signatory contractors when subcontracting utility work in the future, in accordance with its collective agreement with the union.

Three grievances in the Utilities sector have been successfully settled over the past several months.

Earlier this year, Local 1059 settled a grievance against **Ramkey Communications** in the amount of \$20,000. Ramkey had been using non-members to perform work covered by a collective agreement.

Minutes of settlement were reached following a grievance against **Aecon Gas** this summer, also for using non-members to perform work covered by a collective agreement.

Local 1059 negotiated a settlement with **Metro Infrastructure** after the company violated the collective agreement by submitting late remittances for union members. Nearly \$25,000 was recovered by the settlement.

In addition to the successful grievances, the union is glad to announce that **Tdot Group** has signed a Voluntary Recognition Agreement ensuring their required labour force is supplied by Local 1059.

Also this summer, **GTel** locates and **Krene Utility Locate Services** were certified in board area 28 by the Ontario Labour Relations
Board. GTel is a 16-member unit and Krene is a six-member unit.



# Ontario providing free training for construction workers

Three brand new, government-funded projects will help more than 2,000 women and young people across Ontario prepare for careers in the construction trades, officials say.

According to an announcement at the beginning of August, the Provincial Building and Construction Trades Council of Ontario will lead all three projects with \$3.6 million in funding from the provincial government.

The first project will help 700 tradeswomen gain the leadership, communications, health and safety training, and networking opportunities they need to start and advance rewarding careers in the industry.

The second project will provide 1,500 people with access to online resources and training tools so they can explore the skilled trades, build core skills, and find apprenticeship opportunities in their profession of choice.

The third project is an expansion of the PBCTCO's Tomorrow's Trades program to London and Ottawa, where over 60 at-risk students are expected to benefit from hands-on learning, behind the scenes access to high-profile construction projects, and training. The program has previously run in Toronto, Hamilton, and Sudbury

# **Ontario doubling** career fairs to help more young people enter skilled trades

Level Up! — a series of multi-day career fairs focused on the skilled trades will be expanding to more cities across Ontario over the next several months, the provincial government has announced.

Launched last year, the province-wide career fairs are expected to attract over 25,000 students in grades 7 to 12, as well as parents and jobseekers. Each event is an opportunity to learn about Ontario's 144 skilled trades and hear from local tradespeople and employers.

Experts have estimated that Ontario will need over 100,000 new skilled trades workers if the province wants to meet its ambitious housing targets over the next decade. Local 1059 is looking forward to attending London's Level Up! career fair Nov. 1 - 2 at the Western Fair District's pavilion \_

# **Ontario providing free job training** for at-risk workers in London

Four new government-funded training projects will help hundreds of local job seekers and students prepare for meaningful jobs in London and the surrounding region, officials

Led by Over 55 London, Youth Opportunities Unlimited, Pathways Employment Help Centre and WePrep Inc., the programs are designed to prioritize at-risk youth and job seekers over the age of 55 — groups traditionally shut out of the job market.

Nearly 400 jobseekers and 2,300 students are expected to benefit from the programs, gaining skills for careers in construction, manufacturing, property maintenance, hospitality, retail, and other in-demand industries.

Participants will have the chance to explore a range of employment and training options through hands-on training, apprenticeships, onthe-job learning, and financial literacy courses. The financial literacy courses run by We Prep Inc. will be hosted at the Local 1059 Training Centre on Wilton Grove Road

# Increase to Ontario's minimum wage

A reminder that Ontario's new minimum wage — \$16.55 per hour — officially takes effect in October. The bump, announced in March, will make Ontario's minimum wage the third highest in the country. The Yukon's minimum wage is \$16.77 per hour and the federal minimum wage in Canada is \$16.65

# **Province starts** pre-development work for new nuclear generation to power Ontario's growth

Bruce Power - one of Local 1059's signatory employers - has launched community consultations and an environmental assessment to determine if it's possible to add up to 4,800 megawatts (MW) of new nuclear generation onto its current

The plans were unveiled at a news conference in July when the provincial government announced predevelopment work on what could be Ontario's first large-scale nuclear build in over three decades.

Local 1059 business representative Adam Millman attended the event on behalf of the union.

Electricity demand in Ontario is rising for the first time since 2005. Experts at the province's Independent Electricity System Operator have recommended that the province begin planning the development of new long-lead assets, including nuclear power, to meet increasing electricity demand in the 2030s and beyond.

Federal approval is the first step in the process for approving and building new nuclear power generation projects, which could take a decade or longer. A new nuclear station would create thousands of new jobs and generate billions of dollars in economic activity across the province, officials said in July.

"Nuclear power has been the stable backbone of Ontario's clean electricity system for decades, and Bruce Power is ready to play an integral role in addressing the province's future needs," said Mike Rencheck, Bruce Power's president and CEO. "We are starting the federal Impact Assessment process to look at new nuclear generation on our site now, to maximize the future optionality for clean electricity in the province."

# Local 1059 increasing training capacity with major \$830K grant

Plans to expand the Local 1059 Training Centre are now underway, beginning with a demolition project being completed by our members at Jobi Construction.

On the second floor of the Training Centre, a crew from Jobi Construction recently began clearing out large pieces of equipment, HVAC, and other infrastructure previously used by the building's former owners..


When they're done, work will continue to transform the roughly 3,500 square-foot area into a brand new classroom and multi-purpose space as well as resource rooms, offices, and washrooms.

Local 1059 has been quickly growing since its move to Wilton Grove Road in 2020.

The ongoing project to expand our training space is fully funded by a \$830,000 Apprenticeship Capital Grant from the provincial government.

The new space is expected to be ready by the summer of 2024.




