Dear Members,

Before we look ahead to everything we have planned for 2024, I'd like to acknowledge the growth our organization and our membership continued to experience last year. Contributed hours in 2023 eclipsed six million, the highest in the Local's history, even with high inflation and high interest rates creating headwinds in the residential sector. Meanwhile, our Utilities sector — providing vital telecommunications infrastructure to London and Southwestern Ontario — has grown significantly and is now our second largest sector behind concrete formwork.

We're poised to continue this growth trajectory this year. Not only are we in a position to build and maintain projects within the City of London's largest ever capital budget, we can also look forward to growth-driving projects such as Bruce Power's Major Component Replacement Project in Bruce County and the much-anticipated Volkswagen Battery Plant in St. Thomas.

To offset retirements (52 people wrapped up their careers with us last year) and keep up with demand in the skilled trades, we are planning to train another 160 pre-apprentices in 2024. If you know someone who would be a good candidate, please encourage them to apply on our website. In conjunction with job creation and growth, we will continue to engage our members and their families outside of work hours through special events such as family skate nights, hockey and basketball games, The Factory takeover, and members' golf tournaments, just to name a few.

The Local will also continue to lobby all three levels of government to ensure legislation benefiting our members is successful, our training programs are well funded, and critical infrastructure is prioritized by federal, provincial, and local leaders. We are in the midst of a Skills Development Fund application through the provincial government that, if successful, will help fund a significant portion of a future office and training centre in Walkerton. This project is a major part of the Local's long-term plans to better serve members and signatory employers north of London.

On behalf of myself and the entire team at Local 1059, we're looking forward to bringing more growth and opportunities to our membership in 2024, as well as all of the other exciting developments to come this year.

Carlo Mastrogiuseppe After seven years of negotiations, Local 1059 won a long, hardfought battle earlier this year when it successfully certified **Lavis Contracting Co.** — a 94-year-old road building company based in Huron County.

This significant achievement not only grows the Local's membership by approximately 40 hard-working labourers, it also represents a major step towards expanding Local 1059's presence outside of Middlesex County.

We are extremely excited about offering strong wages, benefits, and pension packages to workers in the Huron County area, and look forward to taking further steps to recruit and support skilled labourers in this part of Southwestern Ontario.

The following companies have recently been certified at the Ontario Labour Relations Board:

In addition, **Stone Haven Masonry Inc.** has signed a Voluntary Recognition Agreement, signaling the company's strong belief in Local 1059 and its members.

These agreements highlight significant growth in two of the Local's long-standing sectors, demolition and masonry, as well as growth in an emerging sector, epoxy flooring.

As we look forward to spring I want to offer a heartfelt thank you and happy retirement to former industrial sector representative, Maria McFadden.

I'd also like to welcome back Megan Quinney. Since her return, some members have been assigned a new business representative. Notices have been provided and I'm looking forward to representing members with Aramark and Sodexo.

On March 14, Local 1059 won a significant arbitration award against Toure Cleaning Services Ltd. on behalf of 30 industrial members employed at two separate worksites. The award exceeds \$225,000, the largest the Local has secured in this sector to date. Four separate but related grievances have been filed on behalf of affected members for unpaid wages, benefit contributions, union dues, and applicable damages.

I'd like to highlight the collective action and union power exhibited by members at both sites who worked together with Local 1059 to ensure that no losses were unaccounted for. The Local is now pursuing all options to recover the funds owed to these members.

A grievance with Brook Restoration for non-payment of a member's overnight per-diem was recently settled for \$1,050, paid directly to the member.

Mobil Services recently signed a collective agreement that includes an 18% increase over three years, as well as other premiums and years-of-service incentives. Some more veteran members will receive a 31.3% increase over three years.

A four-year agreement has been reached with multiple employers in our "small roads" collective agreement. Highlights in the agreement include an 18.3% salary increase, a larger allowance for boots and wet weather clothing, better travel and lodging language for members who work out of town, and a 100% increase in nighttime and shift premiums. Carlo Mastrogiuseppe and Joe Calvo also contributed to the new agreement, which will affect more than 30 members.



In the utilities sector, **Groundhog Daylighting** — a family-owned and -operated hydrovac company located in Brantford, Ontario — has signed a Voluntary Recognition Agreement. We are excited for them to join our growing list of signatory employers.

Three recent grievances in the sector include:

- LFN (Start.ca), grieved for subcontracting work to a non-signatory company. This grievance is being settled.
- KWS violated the collective agreement by subcontracting work to workers outside of the Local. Minutes of settlement have been reached.
- Coach Underground was grieved for late remittances for members of Local 1059. These remittances have since been paid in full.

A new signatory employer, Blackwall Forming Ltd., has been signed under the Provincial Formwork Agreement.

Two developer agreements with Old Oak Developments Inc. and Walter Ostojic and Sons Ltd. have also been renewed.

Member Spotlight: Adam Piasecki

Local 1059 member Adam Piasecki says he's thankful for the first aid training that helped him respond quickly to a serious emergency near a jobsite in southeast London.

Piasecki was installing fibre optics with an Aecon Utilities crew last year when he witnessed a collision involving a car and a teenaged boy riding a bicycle.

"I turned around and it happened right in front of me," Piasecki said. "It was actually quite frightening because you don't know in that situation the extent of the damage to that person. It was a lot of force."

Remembering his training, Piasecki said he immediately instructed other witnesses not to move the boy and to instead dial 911 and provide traffic control. He then calmly reassured the young cyclist until an ambulance arrived.

"When something like that happens, it's how you react to the situation. It was more about keeping calm," Piasecki said, adding that first aid training played a key role in his response. "I feel like that's a big part of it. A lot of training before that kind of stuff happens — it makes you more prepared."

Piasecki has been a Local 1059 member for about five years and is now working with Pickard Construction. He said he's grateful for the support he's received from his colleagues since the incident occurred.

Union representatives Josh Stewart and Joe Calvo recently met Piasecki at the Local 1059 Training Centre where they commended him for his actions and presented him with a gift — four tickets to a London Knights game.

Carlos is currently part of a Magil crew working on expanding the footprint of a local auto parts manufacturer in St. Thomas.

Local 1059 Paving the Way for Improved Public Transit in London

Each year Local 1059's skilled labourers work hard to build important infrastructure in London.

One of the most high-profile examples currently underway, and perhaps the largest projects in recent memory, is the city's three new bus rapid transit corridors. The BRT system will be made up of three parts: a downtown loop, a corridor that heads south on Wellington Road and ends at White Oaks Mall, and an east London link that begins downtown and ends at Fanshawe College.

One of those corridors — the first phase of the Wellington gateway, which will eventually connect downtown London to the Thames River — began early last year and is now nearly complete. Over the past several months, more than 100 Local 1059 members have left their fingerprints on asphalt, traffic lights, sidewalks, and other key pieces of infrastructure that will be used to usher in a new era for public transit in London. At the same time, Local 1059 members and signatory employers including Bre-Ex Construction, KWS Electric, Outer Construction, JNF Ready Mix, Mobil Services, and PGC Services are also playing an instrumental part in the repair and replacement of aging watermains, storm drains, and sanitary sewers.

Local 1059 representatives visited several job sites along Wellington Road just prior to the beginning of winter.

"Members are super proud," said Craig Smith, a human resources and safety manager for Bre-Ex, a Local 1059 signatory employer that's won contracts for several sections of London's bus rapid transit project, including the Wellington Road corridor. "Ask any of them. It's stuff they tell their families and their friends (about). It's a legacy that will be there for years to come."

Bre-Ex has been part of multiple infrastructure projects city leaders have approved in order

to keep up with London's growing population. In January, the company won bids for three more BRT-related jobs: the East London Link on Dundas Street, the Highbury Avenue section to Oxford Street, and the Clarks Bridge and Wellington Road project.

"The economic impact of the project for the City of London and surrounding communities is significant," Smith said. "To play a part in the upgrades, and the city's plan for this stuff, it's rewarding. I know the guys take a lot of pride in it."

Local 1059 is very proud to be representing the hard-working people building important infrastructure that will allow our neighbourhoods to continue growing and thriving.

Featuring dedicated lanes and frequent buses, London's BRT system has the potential to change the efficiency of public transit in the city. Construction is slated to be completed by 2027







Accomplishments of Local 1059 Apprentices Recognized at Annual Graduation Dinner

The hard work and determination of Local 1059's newest apprentices was celebrated at the union's annual Apprentice Recognition Dinner this past November.




